Florida is a closed primary state meaning that only voters within a political party may vote in that party's Primary Election. However, if all qualified candidates for an office have the same party affiliation and the winner will have no opposition in the General Election, there is a Universal Primary Contest in which all voters may vote.

In-person Election Day voting for the District 20 Special Election and District 33/94 Special Primary Elections will take place on Tuesday, January 11, 2022. On that day, voters MUST vote at their assigned polling place. The polls will be open from 7:00 A.M. - 7:00 P.M.

Since Florida is a closed-primary state and the race for Senate District 33 is a Democratic primary, voters MUST be registered as a Democrat in order to vote in that election. The deadline to change your party affiliation is Monday, December 13, 2021.

Voters will be required to show picture and signature identification in order to cast their ballot. The most common forms presented are a valid FL-issued driver's license or identification, but any combination of picture AND signature from this list is acceptable:

- U.S. Passport
- Debit/Credit Card
- Military or Veterans Affairs Health ID
- Student ID
- Retirement Center ID

- Neighborhood Association ID
- Public Assistance ID
- Concealed Weapons Permit
- Government-Issued Employee ID (Federal, State, or Local)

Remember, you CANNOT drop off your voted vote-by-mail ballot at your polling place to be counted. On Election Day, vote-by-mail ballots should be hand-delivered to a Supervisor of Elections Drop Box. If you have received a voteby-mail ballot, but you decide to vote in person, please bring your vote-by-mail ballot to your precinct or Early Voting site so it can be VOIDED. The Broward County Supervisor of Elections is committed to following all CDC guidelines and recommendations with regard to COVID-19. We strongly suggest that all voters wear a mask or face covering while inside the polling place. Masks, sanitizer, and cleaning wipes will all be available to voters upon request. # **VOTE-BY-MAIL**

A vote-by-mail ballot refers to a ballot that you request or have delivered to you without having to vote at the polls during early voting or on Election Day. A voter must first be registered to vote before he or she can request a voteby-mail ballot. Effective May 6, 2021, a request to receive a vote-by-mail ballot covers all elections through the end of the calendar year for the next ensuing regularly scheduled general election, and voters must also provide verifiable identifiers to our office to request vote-by-mail ballots, and all requests must be signed. If a vote-by-mail ballot is returned undeliverable, it will cancel a request for future elections and must be re-requested by the voter or designee.

# **RETURNING A VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT**

A vote-by-mail ballot can be returned by mail or hand delivered in person. Please return your voted ballots as early as possible, to ensure timely delivery. If returned by mail, it can be returned by the United States Postal Service or through another private or commercial carrier the ballot must be received by 7pm on Election Day.

Vote-by-mail ballots may also be deposited into secure drop boxes at Supervisor of Elections' main and branch offices until 7:00pm (local time) on Election Day. Vote-by-mail ballots may also be deposited at secure drop boxes at early voting sites.

# **EARLY VOTING (IN-PERSON)**

Early voting is defined as "casting a ballot prior to Election Day at a location designated by the Supervisor of Elections and depositing the voted ballot in to the Tabulator."

Voters can go to any Early Voting Site to cast their ballot. Voters may also hand-deliver their voted vote-by-mail ballots to secured ballot drop boxes at the same sites during Early Voting.

Voters who want to vote early should remember to bring a photo and signature identification with them.
